## **2010 GRASSROOTS GRANT APPLICATION**

Established in 2001, the Grassroots Grant Program provides funding for historic preservation projects in North Dakota. The program is administered by Preservation North Dakota, a private nonprofit organization that provides leadership, educational opportunities, advocacy and resources to help North Dakotans preserve prairie places.

Grants generally range from \$500 to \$5,000. Interested eligible organizations should thoroughly read the guidelines and submit an application to PND postmarked on or before **May 15, 2010**. The selection process is very competitive; applicants are encouraged to contact PND with any questions, as incomplete applications will not be considered.

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### **GRANT GUIDELINES**

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

##### **Prairie Churches Grassroots Grants**

Members of PND and/or PND's Local Affiliate Program will have priority in receiving grants. The property must be located in a rural area or a city with a population of 2,500 or less. The property must meet the standards established by the National Register of Historic Places.

##### **Prairie Places Grassroots Grants**

Members of PND's Local Affiliate Program are eligible to apply. The property must meet the standards established by the National Register of Historic Places.

#### **CONDITIONS**

Applicants must have legal title to the property or the written permission of the owner to carry out the planned restoration project. The legal property owner will be asked to sign a grant agreement.

Applicants must be capable of matching the grant amount dollar-for-dollar. Qualifying matching funds include cash and in-kind contributions (i.e. donated labor and/or supplies). In-kind contributions should account for no more than one-half the total match and must be used in the specific project supported by grant funds, not for work completed prior to the application.

Applications must be postmarked on or before **May 15, 2010**. Grant recipients will be notified no later than June 15, 2010. A grant may be approved for all or a portion of the amount requested. Projects to be funded may not begin until the grant agreement has been signed and must be completed by November 30, 2010.

Grant funds must be used to accomplish restoration projects of properties meeting the standards established by the National Register of Historic Places.

PND requires the placement of a 5"x7" plaque in a prominent location on the property. Cost of the plaque is \$90 (\$45 grant funds + \$45 local funds) and must be included in the project budget. The plaque is provided by PND upon completion of the project.

Grant recipients must include appropriate acknowledgement of PND financial support at the project site and in all printed materials generated for the project.

On-site visits may be scheduled by PND during the term of the project. A final report identifying how the grant funds were used and describing the completed project in comparison with the grant proposal must be filed by November 30, 2010. An on-site visit will be conducted by PND staff at the completion of the project. Grant funds are distributed as reimbursement upon successful completion of these steps.

A property that receives grant funds may not be sold or transferred for the length of the grant agreement (1 year per \$1,000 granted) without the notification and written approval of PND, or the grant funds must be returned.

Any unused funds resulting from uncompleted or unacceptable projects may be allocated by PND to other projects that can be completed by November 30, 2010, or returned to the fund pool for future grant rounds.

## SECTION 2: PROPOSED PROJECT DESCRIPTION

1. Describe the restoration project. What is the current use of the property? What are the plans for its future use? What is the timeline for project completion?
2. Does the project have local support? How will it serve to promote historic preservation in your community?
3. Is the project unique or more than repairing deferred maintenance?
4. How would support of this project benefit historic preservation efforts statewide?

## SECTION 3: FINANCIAL & BUDGET INFORMATION

1. What is the overall cost of the proposed project?
2. List all sources and amounts of cash funding or in-kind contributions. Indicate whether funds are secured or anticipated. For anticipated funds, indicate how/when they will be secured.

5. Are these grant funds crucial for the completion of the project?
